David's daughter, Elizabeth, has notified me that they will be holding a small, informal memorial service for her father at St George's RAF Chapel of Remembrance, at the RAF side of Biggin Hill Airport on Monday 5th August 2024 at 2.30pm. The service will not actually be inside the Chapel but will be outside in the Garden of Remembrance alongside the Chapel.

As she said, if you are an "early Biggin Hill'ite", and one who probably remembers David Porter back then as the founder and owner of Flairavia Flying Club, we would all be pleased to see you at this memorial.

David lived latterly in the North-East, where his funeral service was held, but a memorial service at Biggin Hill seems appropriate and fitting, given his long association with the airfield. He initially served in the Royal Air Force, based at Biggin Hill, before moving across to the civil side.

You may have learnt to fly at Flairavia, and/or been a member of the "social" club and bar, or joined everyone at the annual Flairavia Dinner Dances, or just simply knew David.

AUGUST BIGGIN HILL POSTED FUEL PRICES

The "posted" Biggin Hill Airport fuel prices, *excluding VAT*, for the calendar month of August 2024 are:

£1:81.9 per litre for 100LL Avgas if supplied from the Fuel Bowser (if uplifted using <u>fuel account card Only</u> from the Self-Refuel pumps = minus 5p per litre – and an additional 1p per litre off if also paid by Direct Debit)

£0:87.6 per litre for Jet A1 (Sustainable Aviation Fuel £1:11.1 per litre)

SPECIAL NOTES: Users are advised that <u>credit and debit cards</u> **can no longer** be used at the selfrefuel pumps. If you use self-refuelling, you will need your airport H-TEC fuel account card with you when you go there. (if you haven't got one with you, you will have to go over to the Main Terminal apron to uplift fuel from the bowsers instead).

BIGGIN HILL AIRPORT – A SERIOUS AIRPORT FOR BOTH CORPORATE AND GA OPS

I know that not everyone is overly happy with the way Biggin Hill Airport has changed from the early days when many of us started there.

But sometimes I think it is important to remind us all that, without Andrew Walter's take over back many years ago (when the airport's closure was actually potentially only weeks away!) and his subsequent development, it is almost certain that the airport would have been closed and become another huge housing estate (probably rather like New Addington).

Whilst of course it will never return to like it was when many of us started our flying back in the 1960's, when everyone was moved here from Croydon Airport, that basis of operation would almost certainly have ensured the airport simply wouldn't have survived....

I do accept that, with the development of a significant "Corporate" airport's position for the London area, it may have caused light aircraft operations here to inevitably change – BUT – at least it is still an airport, and still available for general aviation and particularly light aircraft operations, all be it with some operational limitations, rather than us all having to relocate elsewhere.

As I'm sure I have said personally before, I am very proud of what Andrew Walter has achieved for our airport, as without the changes I'm pretty certain we would no longer be here....

Thank you Andrew and your team for what you have achieved for what was of course previously "The Strongest Link" during the Battle of Britain.....

AIRCRAFT PARKING FEES......

I have recently been told by some aircraft owners/operators that parking rates have increased substantially, which seems strange as I know the rates haven't changed since the normal annual review back in April this year.

If you have any concerns, can I suggest that you simply contact the airport directly to ask for their guidance on any invoiced charges that you have received. The best means of contact to seek this guidance is to use the contact details that are contained within your actual invoices.

MONTHLY NEWS FROM THE CEO's OFFICE

July saw the Airport build on what has been a successful first half of the year, with July movements following the same promising trend in May and June. The overall movements were positively affected by both Wimbledon and the Farnborough airshow, the latter of which resulted in Biggin benefitting from some displaced operators. Where the Airport knows it will have increased activity, it will coordinate with base owners and operators to minimise any distribution.

The pressures on the aviation industry as a whole remain and were further compounded in July with the IT failure that left thousands of passengers stranded at Airports across the UK. Fortunately, Biggin Hill was unaffected. The Business Aviation sector continues to see solid growth and the London market figures show the Airport's share marginally increased to around 22%, with Luton dropping to just under 27% and Farnborough stabilising at just under 28%.

The Airport continues its development programme to improve existing infrastructure and improve its service offering to customers. Having installed the new Instrument Runway Visual Range (IRVR) system, which will eventually include 24-hour automated METAR reporting, we are now awaiting an opportunity to complete operational calibration. Work also continues to plan for the runway resurfacing and introduction of centre line lighting in 2025. The Airport will soon start to construct the batching plant that will supply the raw materials for the resurfacing project. The Airport continues to work with a key tenant to progress the Aviation College on site and deliver engineering accommodation.

With the new government in place, the Airport is re-establishing its engagement and emphasizing the important role Business Aviation plays in supporting the UK economy and the role Airports play as a catalyst for inward investment, economic growth and job creation. The Airport site generates a GVA (gross value added) of £200 million to the UK economy and, importantly, £143m (70%) of this is captured within the London Borough of Bromley. Furthermore, the Airport is delighted to see it has been identified as a key area for economic growth in the draft Bromley Growth plan 2024 to 2027.

The continues to work alongside the CAA regarding the trial of the new instrument approach to Rwy 03, the removal of dependencies on the VOR DME and the completion of the 21 RNAV overlay. The Airport remains hopeful that the trail of the new 03 instrument approach will take place in the fourth quarter of this year.

The Airport continues to work hard to roll out the 2nd phase of its Air Quality Monitoring initiative with the installation of additional sensors. The monitors will have an increased number of sensors to detect SO2 (Sulphur Dioxide), NO2 (Nitrogen Dioxide), CO (Carbon Monoxide), VOC (Volatile Organic Compounds) and 03 (Ground Ozone). The sensors will also detect Particulate matter 1, 2.5 and 10 micrograms of solid or liquid particles in the atmosphere. The Airport will be working with the newly formed Airport Residents' Noise Action Forum to see how the Airport might report on Air Quality in the future.
