THIS MONTHLY NEWSLETTER

Just a brief reminder that I am sure most people do know – obviously British Summer Time (BST) ceased from Sunday 27th October at 2am, so the UK local time is now back to Greenwich Mean Time/Co-ordinated Universal Time (GMT/UTC) until next Spring – I do of course realise that all UK residents are fully aware of that, but quite a few of our readers do live outside the UK so this is really just to keep them up to date....

OCTOBER WEATHER

October weather has been quite unsettled. Of course there were some good flying days, sometimes even a few in a row too! But the reality was that there were always lots of adverse weather days regularly this month, after, in some days, just a couple of good weather days. So, the month really has not been as good as we all hoped!

It is now obviously getting to the start of the Winter, and that's when we all know we can't get as much flying, especially student training, as we now move into the next month or so....

So – fingers crossed – let's hope there is a bit more flyable weather to enable us all to keep our flying experience up to date. Let's hope there is at least enough flying to enable the flying clubs and schools to generate sufficient funds to keep them in business.

BIGGIN HILL AIRPORT

Biggin Hill Airport is very well organized, and they are starting to get ready for a major improvement to the airport's main runway 03/21, where it will be fully resurfaced (mainly overnight) in the early part of 2025 and additionally have runway centreline lighting installed. See also the section, which describes these plans, towards the end of this Newsletter written by the airport's CEO, David Winstanley.

They are also seemingly confident now that the new instrument approach procedure for runway 03 will soon be accepted by the CAA for calibration.

Then hopefully the new 03 instrument approach will be available when that runway is required to be used, which will avoid the circling to land for aircraft to get to that runway. That should

help to minimise the noise concerns that local residents have been experiencing when commercial aircraft have been circling quite low after the instrument approach to 21.

THE LIGHT AVIATION STEERING GROUP

Just another brief note -

If you are a regular Biggin Hill Airport flyer, or if you are a private owner whose aircraft is based at Biggin, then you should consider registering to be able to attend the Light Aviation Steering Group meetings that take place every two months.

Advise her who you are, and what your involvement is at the airport – ie. Private Pilot who flies at the airport regularly, or that you are a private owner of the Biggin Hill based aircraft's registration – and tell her that you would like to be able to attend the Light Aviation Steering Group meetings. Do also confirm that you will always acknowledge the email invitation each time for the meetings and state whether you will attend or if you will not be attending so that she can plan accordingly.

NOVEMBER BIGGIN HILL POSTED FUEL PRICES

The "posted" Biggin Hill Airport fuel prices, <u>excluding VAT</u>, for the calendar month of November 2024 are:

£1:70.8 per litre for 100LL Avgas if supplied from the Fuel Bowser (if uplifted using <u>fuel account card Only</u> from the Self-Refuel pumps = minus 5p per litre – and an additional 1p per litre off if also paid by Direct Debit)

£0:80.5 per litre for Jet A1 (Sustainable Aviation Fuel £1:04.0 per litre)

<u>SPECIAL NOTES:</u> Users are advised that <u>credit and debit cards can no longer</u> be used at the self-refuel pumps. If you use self-refuelling, you will need your airport H-TEC fuel account card with you when you go there. (if you haven't got one with you, you will have to go over to the Main Terminal apron to uplift fuel from the bowsers instead).

MONTHLY NEWS FROM THE CEO's OFFICE

As October draws to a close and the clocks have gone back, the Airport has accelerated its preparations for winter operations, whilst keeping our fingers crossed for no snow and a mild winter!! October was a steady, if unspectacular month, for the Airport but it continued the trend of lower movements but solid financial performance. Again, given the continuing and growing global instability, aviation appears to be riding out the storm and the sector continues to demonstrate its resilience. That said, at the time of writing this report the chancellor's budget has not been announced, so let's keep our fingers collectively crossed.

The Airport continues its development programme to improve existing infrastructure and improve its service offering to customers. Unfortunately, having installed the new Instrument Runway Visual Range (IRVR) system, which will include 24-hour automated METAR reporting, we are still waiting for enough low visual days to calibrate the equipment and obtain CAA sign off. Preparations are well underway regarding the runway resurfacing and introduction of centre line lighting in 2025. The equipment for the batching plant that will supply the raw materials for the resurfacing is under construction. The Airport has launched an information campaign to ensure residents are fully aware of what the Airport is doing and how hard the Airport will be working to reduce any noise impact. The Airport continues to work with tenants and other external operators regarding additional hangar developments and improved facilities.

The Airport continues to focus on engagement with local residents through the Airport Residents Noise Action Forum (ARNAF), which focuses on direct engagement with Resident Associations. The ARNAF is proving to be an extremely effective forum for ensuring both the Airport and residents focus on moving the noise abatement plan forward for the real benefit of both operators and residents. Critically, we have invited pilots to attend and discuss procedures from their perspective, which residents have found to be extremely helpful.

As previously mentioned, as we look towards the end of this year and early next, the Airport continues to progress the 2nd phase of its Air Quality Monitoring initiative. The new monitors, which we installed earlier this year will detect SO2 (Sulphur Dioxide), NO2 (Nitrogen Dioxide), CO (Carbon Monoxide), VOC (Volatile Organic Compounds) and 03 (Ground Ozone). The sensors will also detect Particulate matter 1, 2.5 and 10 micrograms of solid or liquid particles in the atmosphere. The Airport will be working with the ARNAF to see how the Airport might report on Air Quality in the future.

I was delighted with the improved attendance at the most recent Light Aviation Steering Group and would like to thank those who attended. The Steering Group ensures home based private pilots have a voice and get the opportunity to engage directly with the Airport on matters concerning the GA community. This is your group and its effectiveness depends on active involvement.

Work continues with the CAA regarding the trial of the new instrument approach to Rwy 03, the removal of dependencies on the VOR DME, and the completion of the 21 RNAV overlay. The Airport remains hopeful that the Trial Plan and IFP design for the 03-instrument approach will be approved in November and that the Airport can then move towards implementing the trial.
